The Van Buren Board of Education is seeking a superintendent to begin on July 1, 2016. The Board is being assisted in its search by Michigan Association of School Boards.

The Van Buren School District is located midway between Detroit and Ann Arbor in Western Wayne County and a bit of Washtenaw County, conveniently near two airports and crisscrossed by two interstate highways. It serves about 5,200 students from parts of Canton, Sumpter, Ypsilanti, and Van Buren Townships, plus the city of Belleville. Van Buren is a thriving community of great economic and ethnic diversity, with a variety of housing options, major corporate employers, and the largest recreational lake in Wayne County. The District has a variety of parks, plus many civic, service, and social organizations that allow for a rich community life.
